**Subject: Regarding BRAP Reform no- 138 "Third party Certification"**

This in reference to the ongoing exercise of Ease of Doing Business, ranking by DPIIT under State Business Reform Action Plan 2024 in compliance to Reform No. 138 – Labour Regulation Enablers - Third party certification for boilers under the Boilers Act, 1923.

**The department would like to inform that:**

1. There is no Boiler Manufacturer/ Boiler Part Manufacturer/ Erector of Boiler in Meghalaya.
2. There is no Third-Party Agencies available in Meghalaya assessed or registered/ declared who can certify/ inspect the factories and Boilers under the Factories Act 1948 and the Boilers Act, 1923 respectively. There are only 52 registered boilers in entire Meghalaya. All inspections are carried out by **Inspectors of Boilers and Factories, Meghalaya** as per the Meghalaya Boilers Rules, 1986 (No: Labour-93/83/50, dated 21st March 1988), the Boilers Act, 1923 and the Indian Boiler Regulations, 1950.


However, The State Government shall make a provision for implementing Third Party Certification/ Inspection whenever such type of agencies is registered to be empanelled and authorized through the office of the Chief Inspector of Boilers and Factories and all necessary initiatives will be as per the qualification criteria/ terms and conditions provide below:

1. Graduate in Mechanical/ Production/ Power Plant/ Metallurgical engineering from a recognized institution and
2. Minimum 5 years of experience in the field related to boilers
3. Publishing the list of Third-Party Agencies/ Individuals in the Invest Meghalaya Portal.

**As the department does not have any recognized Third-Party Agencies who can certify/ inspect boilers, the State would like to apply for NA2.**

- iii. the reform is not applicable due to unique geographical condition of the State & UT or,
- iv. any other reason which is beyond the control of the State & UT.
