Terms of Reference of the Task Force Committee:

- To develop and implement a comprehensive policy framework to transition low-risk inspections to a self-certification model and medium-risk inspections to a third-party certification mechanism, ensuring alignment with national and state regulatory standards and industry norms.
- 2. To collaborate closely with relevant Government Departments, Industry Stakeholders and third-party agencies to ensure the effective and seamless implementation of the new inspection models.

- 3. To continuously monitor and assess the effectiveness of the self-certification and third-party certification mechanisms, providing recommendations for improvement as necessary to optimize performance.
- 4. To identify and shortlist competent third-party agencies to undertake certification responsibilities for inspections, ensuring they meet required qualifications and standards.
- 5. To periodically review and update the criteria for risk categorization to ensure they remain current, effective and relevant to evolving business and regulatory environments.
- 6. Such other powers and functions as may be prescribed from time to time.
